Professor John Manners-Bell BA (Hons) MSc AKC FCILT

Prof John Manners-Bell is Chief Executive of global market research organisation Transport Intelligence, Honorary Visiting Professor at the London Metropolitan University's Guildhall Faculty of Business and Law and an adviser to the World Economic Forum. He has over 25 years' experience working in and analysing the global logistics sector. John started his working life as an operations manager of a logistics company based in the UK. Prior to establishing Transport Intelligence in 2002, he worked as an analyst in consultancies specialising in international trade, transport and logistics. He also spent a number of years as a manager of global express and logistics company, UPS, in a strategic marketing and communications role.

John holds an MSc in Transport Planning and Management from University of Westminster and is an Associate of King's College London where he studied Classics and Theology. He is a Fellow of the UK Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport and former Chair of the Supply Chain and Logistics Global Advisory Council of the World Economic Forum. He has also advised the European Commission Directorate-General for Energy and Transport. He has written three books on the industry - 'Global Logistics Strategies: Delivering the Goods', 'Supply Chain Risk: Understanding Emerging Threats to Global Supply Chains' and 'Logistics and Supply Chains in Emerging Markets'.

'Attracting great people to the logistics sector is one of the biggest challenges facing the industry and is a cause very close to my heart. Aspire does fantastic work in enabling people worldwide to develop their careers through training awards. This not only strengthens the industry but also provides life changing opportunities. Steve McCann - CILT Level 3 Certificate in Green Logistics

Going through a really bad recession and only working part-time hours (on average 8 a week since 2012) I was looking for any opportunity possible of enabling me to secure more sustainable work. I saw an advertisement in the CILT Focus magazine referring to the charitable side of the CILT, applied for it and was fortunate enough to be awarded coursework.

I applied for the Green Logistics course as it's at the formative stages of its life cycle in the logistics sector. Due to the UK not meeting its greenhouse gas targets, there will, hopefully, be a lot more opportunities for someone who has successfully completed industry recognised coursework based on the environment.

The most rewarding aspect of the course is that, irrespective of how little you do to cut out waste and emissions, you are contributing to the greater good of the environment and giving successive generations chances they might not have enjoyed if we didn't act now. Learning about the background and current ideas within the logistics environmental side of the business was very rewarding.

The experience has been very positive. Learning a subject I knew very little about, and putting what has been learnt, into practice will benefit myself (as well as the environment) and each company I work with.

Aspire is there to help those who are finding getting back into employment tough financially. Irrespective of whether you're young or old, new to the industry or otherwise, it's never too late to learn new things especially with the turmoil of a recession and what it's doing to the logistics sector.

The staff at Aspire have been extremely helpful throughout the application process and their words of encouragement have been gratefully received. My mentor/tutor Nick Wright's knowledge has been taken on board and his advice, promptings and comments have been inspirational.


